Trinity Sunday – May 31, 2015

The Trinity

Christians have been trying to understand the *mystery* of the Trinity for centuries, the doctrine that our one God is Three Persons. Mystery, not as a "whodunit", but as truth that cannot be fully known, except by revelation. St. Patrick used the image of the shamrock to express the equality of Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Others have used specific words to speak to the functions of the Three Persons: Creator, Redeemer, Sanctifier. Ancient theologians described the persons of the Trinity being in a mutual dance. But words are always inadequate. The Trinity is about God who is for us all the time. And God is first about relationship relationship between the Three Persons, and their relationship with each of us.

The Three Persons of the Trinity are in *mutual relationship* with one another, a relationship of *love* and *reciprocity*, a relationship of *love* and *equality*. And that relationship is further expressed in the boundless, unshakable, eternal love God has for each of us. Unclear? Maybe the simplest thing we can say about the Trinity is that God's love for us never changes.

On this Trinity Sunday we welcome Jameson Joseph Drozd to be baptized into this fellowship, using the words Jesus taught us: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. As we gather around the Font, and then around the Table, we are reminded that God's love embraces each of us no matter where we are on our journey of faith.

About Our Worship

If you are here for the first time today, welcome! The style of our worship is Anglo-Catholic which draws upon ancient liturgical practices of the Christian Church. You'll see graceful ritual and colorful vestments, hear chant and wonderful music, and even smell a little incense. We try not to make our worship stuffy or stodgy and, so, you might see our acolytes in sandals or sneakers! We hope that you will come away refreshed and renewed – and that you'll return often.

Holy Communion

All are welcome to receive the Holy Eucharist – toddlers, children, people of faith and those unsure of their direction, without regard to politics, race or orientation. Consecrated grape juice is available in the glass chalices.

Kneeling

The majority of our congregation observes the ancient position of standing for prayer. Kneeling cushions are available in the back of the church.

Children

Children through 3 years of age are welcome to find a safe space for play in the Nursery, which is staffed from 8:45AM to 12:15PM.

The Chapel of the Angels, located on the right side of the church, a safe and quiet space for **infants and**

toddlers with their parents. "Busy bags" are available in the back of the

church.

Children's Sermon Activity

Children ages 4-7 are invited to gather in the center aisle near the main door to listen to the Gospel and then follow the adult leader to the Guild Room where they will participate in a special worship activity. They will return to the church at the Passing of the Peace.

The Music Notes this morning focus on the anthems at 9 AM, which are not listed in the Service Leaflet this morning. At the Offertory, we hear the *Esurientes* from Vivaldi's *Magnificat*, sung by

sopranos Brie Cornwell and Rebecca Johnson. Vivaldi best known choral work is the *Gloria* but he set many sacred texts and the *Magnificat* is just as lovely, with exciting choruses and lyrical solos and duets. During communion, Brie and Rebecca are joined by mezzosoprano Natalie Kikkenborg to sing *Lift thine eyes* from *Elijah* by Felix Mendelssohn. This sublime setting of Psalm 121 is intended for three boy sopranos but is equally effective with women's voices.
