"We've figured out a system that works for our family of five. We did a rather non-traditional Maundy-Thursday-athome experience (which everyone loved). We eat dinner each night together and I've honed my baking skills and make homemade bread. We play a game of popcorn prayer - a different person prays over our meal and bread at dinner. We find a new park to explore and hike every weekend.


